COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

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<u>Public Announcement</u> In compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act of the State of New Jersey, adequate notice of this meeting of the Borough Council has been provided to three newspapers and published in the January 14, 2016 issue of the Beach Haven Times.

A meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City was held on the above date in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall. Roll call, followed by a salute to the flag, showed the following to be in attendance:

Councilman Hadash, Councilman Hartney, Councilman Wm. Hodgson, Councilman Klose, Councilman Russell, Councilwoman Siciliano and Mayor F. Hodgson.

Mayor Hodgson called for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting held on June 8, 2016. Upon a motion by Mr. Russell, seconded by Mr. Hartney, the minutes were approved as presented.

Acknowledgement of the 2015 Audit, resolution certifying that the Comments and Recommendations have been read by each member of the governing body, as confirmed by Mayor F. Hodgson, and the group affidavit will be executed. Upon a motion by Mr. Klose, seconded by Mr. Russell, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION 2016-107

GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2015 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, <u>R.S.</u> 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and

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Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of governing body attached hereto: and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing Body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of <u>R.S.</u> 52:27BB-52, to wit:

<u>R.S.</u> 52:27 BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office.

WHEREAS, a corrective action plan, if applicable, outlining actions to be taken to correct the item listed in the comments and recommendations of the Auditor has been prepared in accordance with the law and is on file and available for public inspection in the office of the Municipal Clerk.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City, hereby states that it has complied with N.J.A.C. 5:30-6.5 and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.

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Councilman William Hodgson, Chairman of Police gave a Statistical Report of Operations for the month of June 2016. He mentioned the good turnout with coffee with Cops and commended Officer Sarah Roe for her community service in initiating a grocery drive for the St. Francis Center.

Councilwoman Jackie Siciliano, Chairwoman of Streets & Roads commented on the completion of street sweeping. She also mentioned her June 17th meeting with US Army Corps of Engineers regarding a 3 year study on Cat 4 preparedness; however after discussion ensued nuisance flooding will be added to that study. Councilwoman Siciliano also reported that she and Mayor Hodgson met with the DEP regarding the same issue of nuisance flooding as well as channel dredging, which has been halted due to NJ DOT stop work orders. She will be meeting with NJ DEP engineers to find workable solutions to frequent flooding.

Councilman Peter Hartney, Chairman of Beaches and Environmental reported that the replenishment project should be coming south in about two weeks and that the second phase of the Coastal Resiliency meeting has taken place. He also reported that Surf City beaches placed among the top five beaches according the NJ Sea Grant Poll. Councilman Hartney would like to thank Borough Superintendent Tom Hudson and Lifeguard Captain Mark Dileo who keep the beaches safe and clean. Also, beach badge sales have made revenue goals ten days earlier. After reporting on beaches and environmental issues he motioned for the adoption of Resolution 2016-104, seconded by Mr. Klose.
