With a vote in the affirmative, the first reading by the title of Ordinance 2023-13 was approved. Ordinance 2023-13 authorizes funding for repairs and rehabilitation work to municipal buildings.

Councilman Russell announced it was a good season. He then provided the statistics for the beach. There were no major issues, no injuries, and we had good lifeguard coverage all seasons. Councilman Russell moved Resolution 2023-141. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. Roll call reflected the following votes in approval: Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Council President Wm. Hodgson provided the statistical report for the police department. The value of the stolen property was \$39,000.00; it was a recovered stolen vehicle and stolen e-bikes. On August 21st, the police department held the "Fill a Cruiser Food Drive," which was very successful. All of the donated food was delivered to the St. Francis Center. Trunk or Treat is scheduled for October 28th from 5 pm to 7 pm. He thanked the fire and police departments for all of their hard work. Council President Wm. Hodgson moved Resolution 2023-140. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. Roll call reflected the following votes in approval: Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Little, Mr. McMenamin, Mr. Russell & Mrs. Siciliano. Nays: none. Councilwoman Siciliano reported that we are going to be busy again. The road construction on N. 8th will begin on Sept 18th. The affected area will be the 100 and 200 Blocks of N. 8th Street. The administrative staff organized a Q&A for the public in the affected area. The meeting was well attended. The Borough engineer was on the call and answered many questions. We are grateful for the administrative staff. Next up is the bulkhead work on N. 15th Street. The earliest start date is Sept 25th, and the latest is October 2nd. The project could take two to three weeks. Please proceed cautiously as you proceed in town with the blinking lights being turned on this week.

Councilman Hartney provided the final statistical report for the beach badge sales. It was accomplished through the hard work of the beach badge-checking staff. He presented and honored Aiden Gridley, Wynter Hall, Tyler Leidemer and Alan Valdez with certificates for selling over or near 1000 daily beach badges for the season. The program on Bay Beach ended; it was the 14th season. We had attendees from as far as Australia and England and all over the country. He thanked the folks from Re-Clam the Bay.

Councilman Little reported that it was a big month for the Water and Sewer Department. Provided the work order report. The well booster pump at Well 7 is a big project and is supposed to be moving forward tomorrow. We adjusted the packing at Well 6 on the motor pump shaft and cleaned the three pump houses. The big news is that we are in the process of a water tower project. The lowest responsible bidder at \$655,800.00 was Allied Painting from Cherry Hill. The last time it was completed was in 2003, and he explained the repairs. We will move to the next water tower on the 14th Street tower next year. He thanked the mayor for his leadership on the matter with all the delays.

BOROUGH OF SURF CITY COUNTY OF OCEAN

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2023-13

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS TO MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS, APPROPRIATING \$300,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$285,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Surf City, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$300,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$15,000 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$285,000, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of various improvements to Borough buildings, including, but not limited to, roof and structural repairs, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$285,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$300,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The

excess of the appropriation of \$300,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$15,000 down payment for said purposes.

- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is five (5) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$285,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$30,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.
- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.
- Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Surf City, New Jersey, desires to amend the 2023 Capital Budget of the said municipality by increasing the amount thereon to include improvements to the streets/roads and related expenses for the Borough of Surf City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City, County of Ocean, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The 2023 Capital Budget of the Borough of Surf City is hereby amended by adding thereto a Schedule to read as follows:
