

**Borough of Surf City
Governing Body Meeting Minutes**

Mayor F. Hodgson called the meeting to order, reading the following statement: in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act of the State of New Jersey, adequate notice of this meeting of the Borough Council has been provided to three newspapers and published in the February 18, 2021 issue of the Beach Haven Times. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this meeting took place on a remote platform called GoTo Meeting. Notice of directions and call-in information had been published in the same edition of the Beach Haven Times and posted on the Borough website.

Roll call reflected the following members present: Councilman John G. Hadash, Councilman Peter Hartney, Councilman William D. Hodgson, Councilman James B. Russell, Councilwoman Jaqueline L. Siciliano & Mayor Francis R. Hodgson. Absent: none.

All present joined Mayor F. Hodgson in a salute to the Flag.

Councilman Russell moved to approve the minutes from the April 14, 2021 regular meeting. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the minutes were approved as presented.

Councilman Russell moved to approve the introduction and first reading by title for Ordinance 2021-08. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the following title was read and approved.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF ANY CLASS OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES WITHIN THE BOROUGH'S GEOGRAPHICAL BOUNDARIES AND ESTABLISHING CHAPTER XV OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY ENTITLED "SALE OF CANNABIS PROHIBITED".

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

Councilman Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the following was adopted.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING, REVISING, AND/OR REPEALING ORDINANCES ENTITLED “REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, 2000” SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 30 ENTITLED ZONING SECTION 11.2(1), SECTION 6.4(B) AND SECTION 7.4(B). AS FOLLOWS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City, as follows.

SECTION 1

Chapter 30 Section 11.2(1) entitled Zoning is hereby added, as follows. Pool equipment and air conditioner platforms combined should not to exceed the span of four (4) feet by eight (8) feet, shall not be counted in the calculation of lot coverage and shall not encroach more than four (4) feet into the side yard setback.

SECTION 2

Section 30-6.4(b) entitled “Building Area and Dimensions” is hereby revised, as follows. The maximum height of the main building shall be no more than thirty-three (33) feet above the elevation of the center line of the street upon which the lot fronts. The minimum finished grade elevation for newly constructed and substantially improved buildings (as defined), including the slab, shall not be lower than one (1) foot above the centerline of the street. The minimum finished grade elevation for existing dwellings, including the slab, shall not be lower than four (4) inches above the edge of the pavement of the street. For the purposes of this section, existing dwellings shall mean dwelling units for which an original certificate of occupancy has been issued prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 3

Section 30-7.4(b) entitled “Building Area and Dimensions” is hereby revised, as follows. The maximum height of the main building shall be no more than thirty-three (33) feet above the

elevation of the center line of the street upon which the lot fronts. The minimum finished grade elevation for newly constructed and substantially improved buildings, including the slab, shall not be lower than one (1) foot above the centerline of the street. The minimum finished grade elevation for existing buildings, including the slab, shall not be lower than four (4) inches above the edge of the pavement of the street. For the purposes of this section, existing dwellings shall mean dwelling units for which an original certificate of occupancy has been issued prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 4

If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment after a second reading and publication, as required by law.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY AND THE TOWNSHIP OF

LONG BEACH UNDER THE SHARED SERVICES ACT, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 ET SEQ. DESIGNATING THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH AS THE LEAD AGENCY FOR THE PROVISION OF A MUNICIPAL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, 40A:65-1 et seq., authorizes several municipalities to agree to provide services jointly by contract when approved by resolution under N.J.S.A.40A:65-5; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Surf City wishes to enter into an agreement with the Township of Long Beach, the Borough of Beach Haven, the Borough of Harvey Cedars, the Borough of Ship Bottom and the Borough of Barnegat Light for the provision of a Municipal Transportation System and designating the Township of Long Beach as lead agency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED by the Borough of Surf City:

1. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk of the Borough of Surf City shall be and are hereby authorized and directed to enter and execute a Shared Services Agreement.
2. A copy of the Agreement together with the agreement annexed shall further remain on file and be available for public inspection at the office of the Municipal Clerk located at the Borough of Surf City Municipal Building, 813 Long Beach Blvd., Surf City, New Jersey 08008.
3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon final adoption.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Surf City to authorize and direct the Borough Clerk to place an advertisement for the Borough in the annual Surf City Yacht Club Yearbook.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of Surf City that the ban of amplified music be temporarily suspended, effective immediately with the following provisions.

1. Outdoor amplified/live music be permitted from 11:00 am until 9:00 pm, daily.

2. Effective until September 10, 2021 or until terminated by Mayor or Council.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY,
AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A REVISED SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE
COUNTY OF OCEAN FOR FIRE INSPECTION SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean (“County”) serves as the Local Enforcing Agency (“LEA”) for the Borough of Surf City (“Borough”) and is responsible for conducting certain fire inspection services on behalf of the Borough pursuant to the Uniform Fire Safety Act, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-192, et. seq. (“Act”), and the Uniform Fire Code, N.J.A.C. 5:70-1.1, et. seq. (“Code”); and

WHEREAS, the County and the Borough previously entered into a Shared Services Agreement for the provision of certain fire inspection services dated November 7, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Borough wish to terminate and cancel that agreement and enter into a revised Shared Services Agreement under which the Borough shall be responsible for conducting all smoke alarm, carbon monoxide alarm, and portable fire extinguisher compliance inspections within the Borough as required by the Act and Code and for establishing the fees for the same as set forth in the revised agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto and made part hereof as Schedule “A”; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et. seq., specifically authorizes local government units including counties and municipalities to enter into Shared Services Agreements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 14th day of April 2021 by the Governing Body of the Borough of Surf City, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

1. That the Governing Body does hereby authorize the execution of a Shared Services Agreement with the County for the provision for fire inspection services, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Schedule “A”.
2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and the Borough Clerk to attest to the agreement.
3. That a certified copy of this resolution and agreement shall be kept on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk and available for public inspection during normal business hours.
4. That a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded by the Municipal Clerk to the County of Ocean.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Surf City duly advertised for the receipt of bids for the 2020 CDBG CT-1532-20 Borough Parking Lot Reconstruction, Resurfacing and Handicap Access; and

WHEREAS, in response to the invitation to bidders, four (4) bids were received on April 8, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the bids were reviewed by the Borough Engineer and it has been determined that Swift & Son, Inc. has submitted the lowest responsible bid in accordance with the bid specifications, said bid being \$44,260.00; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body to award a contract for the 2020 CDBG CT-1532-20 Borough Parking Lot Reconstruction, Resurfacing and Handicap Access to Swift & Son, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder.

Mayor F. Hodgson commented that the Borough would continue to raise the streets with the available NJ DOT grant funds.

Councilman Hartney reported that the badge checkers are in the process of hiring for all positions. He attended a meeting with the other local mayors and representatives to discuss the offshore wind project.
