Mayor F. Hodgson stated the December 8, 2021, minutes should reflect the adoption of the ordinance replacing the Flood Chapter, was adopted that ordinance under duress. Representatives from FEMA contacted the Borough Clerk and advised her that if the Borough did not adopt the ordinance that the NFIP would not back any mortgages in Surf City. He mentioned numerous natural disasters in various locations throughout the United States and questioned if FEMA has enforced the same regulations upon them. Mayor F. Hodgson contacted Congressman Van Drew and Senator Chris Connors to have a virtual meeting with other Long Beach Island municipalities and Stafford Township to discuss the matter. The result of the meeting is that Congressman Van Drew and Senator Chris Connors would help to organize NJ coastal communities to represent the group against FEMA. The ordinance was adopted to protect the Borough but was adopted under duress and we had to pass it under threat.

Councilman Russell announced Bob McGowan, the Borough Superintendent, is busy getting the pickleball and tennis courts ready. The department has been grooming Veteran's Park for the annual Memorial Day service scheduled for May 28, 2022 at 11:00 am. The Lifeguard in Training (LIT) and Lifeguard positions are filling up. The LIT program is so well attended in Surf City that a competitive tournament may be planned for this season. He moved 2022-93, which was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson provided the April 2022 statistical report for the police department. On April 16th the Easter Egg hunt had the largest attendance yet, with 5500 stuffed eggs for the kids to find. The effort put into the event, speaks volumes of our police department and the other volunteers. Two grocery carts worth of nonperishables were collected and delivered to the food pantry at the St. Francis Center. We have two new Class II officers that graduated the academy this month. There are three returning Class I officers and one new officer for the season. The Class II officers can fill in for regular full-time officers. He moved 2022-94, which was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilwoman Siciliano stated the Department of Public Works (DPW) continues to fill potholes, repair barricades and fill in street ends. Additionally, they have painted the street end garbage cans. The annual street sweeping of the Borough was completed last week. The project for the NJDOT project at N. 4th, N. 3rd and Schoderer Avenue will be wrapped by next week. The survey work for N. 1st, N 3rd and Shore Avenue is being completed right now, to bid over the summer. The Borough received notice to submit the application for the 2023 NJDOT project.

Councilman Hartney announced the May 21, 2022 town wide yard sale. He also mentioned that the beaches are in good condition. Ocean County completed the work to the dune walkovers, putting hard pack down. Last week, on May 1, 2022, began the preseason badge sales, anyone can still send reservations until May 31, 2022. During the first week, 2642 badges we sold at the badge booth.

A letter was received from Dr. Ron Willoughby of the Surf City Yacht Club requesting provisions from the Borough is relation to them hosting the 2022 regatta. Councilman Russell made comments about the schedule of requests. Mayor F. Hodgson announced that we had researched the 2018 memorandum referenced in the request and there were no findings. Mayor F. Hodgson addressed the request for Sunday trash pick and everyone agreed that it can be accommodated if the DPW is working that day and there is time. The Borough workers can drop the barriers off on Friday and the Yacht club can set them up, as long as they maintain access to the street ends. The Yacht Club is also requesting to use the boat ramp at no cost. They can go before 9 am and after 5 pm to use the boat ramp at no cost. The yacht club will be directed to reach out to the EJ school, Surf City Fire Company and the County for the requests pertaining to those agencies. The yacht club mentioned giving permission for the police department to place the radar anywhere. The department will place radars as they see fit.

A RESOLUTION TO AFFIRM THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY'S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS.

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Borough of Surf City to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Right Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against Discrimination, the Americans with Disability Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act, and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Surf City has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ADOPTED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Surf City that:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Borough of Surf City by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Borough of Surf City shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person's constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Borough of Surf City's business or using the facilities or property of the Borough of Surf City.

Section 2: The prohibitions and requirements of this resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer or inter-local organization, whether structured as a government entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Borough of Surf City to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Borough of Surf City.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Borough Council may establish written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this resolution. Such procedures shall include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

Section 6: The Borough Council may establish written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Borough of Surf City as well as all other entities subject to this resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this resolution.

Section 7: The Borough Council may establish a system to monitor compliance and shall report at least annually to the Governing Body the results of the monitoring.

Section 8: At least annually, the Borough Council shall cause a summary of this resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this resolution to be communicated within the Borough of Surf City. This communication shall include a statement from the governing body expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Borough of Surf City's bulletin board

Section 9: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, IN SUPPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE CAUSEWAY EXPANSION AND REHABILITATION ROAD PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation ("NJDOT") continues to work upon the final phase of the multi-year, federally funded Causeway expansion and rehabilitation road project ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, there have been and continue to be significant concerns regarding continuation of the Project pursuant to its existing schedule and format through the peak summer season on Long Beach Island given the significant road closures and alterations to the traffic patterns of the main roadway access to and from the Island; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Surf City ("Borough"), its officials, and representatives of other Island municipalities have been diligently meeting with the NJDOT in an effort to secure revisions to the Project to minimize the impact upon the traffic patterns and the public health, welfare, and safety; and

WHEREAS, following additional investigation and negotiations the NJDOT has agreed to the following changes to the ongoing Project during the peak 2022 summer season and thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has agreed to postpone the work upon 9th Street until after Labor Day 2022 and instead perform the 8th Street work, and, therefore, the left lane on 9th Street shall be reopened to traffic before Memorial Day 2022 through September 2022; and

WHEREAS, in addition and where feasible, the NJDOT shall install temporary walkways in the 9th Street area in areas where sidewalks and pedestrian access have been impacted and where such is not possible the NJDOT shall install appropriate signage and access will be created to safely detour pedestrians around the closed portion of sidewalk; and

WHEREAS, in order to for the NJDOT to commit to providing two (2) travel lanes both on and off the island during the day and address additional concerns raised about potential traffic impacts during the peak summer season weekends, the NJDOT and its contractor shall be required to work extended overnight work hours of 6:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m., Monday through Thursday and possible 9:00 a.m. through 3:00 p.m., as required; and

be extended further across Route 72; (iv) Circle Drive shall be open in advance of the Memorial Day Weekend holiday; (v) work on Circle Drive will pause and resume after Labor Day; and

All present joined Mayor F. Hodgson in a salute to the Flag.

Councilman Russell moved to approve the minutes from the June 8, 2022, regular meeting. Councilwoman Siciliano seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the minutes were approved as presented.

Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approve Ordinance 2022-03 as introduced and read by title. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the following was approved.

Matt Nichols, from Northside Bar and Grill, spoke in support to using amplified music while outdoor dining is in place. He requested for the relief to be extended through the rest of summer.

Diane DeGraff, Beachwood resident, manager of the Northside, states that she ensures the bands are over by 9:00 pm and lots of families enjoy it.

Todd Kostrub, of N. 1719 Long Beach Boulevard, spoke against the relief of the temporary suspension of the amplified music ban. He supported the music the first two years and now the third year, he states it is affecting his household. He feels the Borough has an amplified music ordinance for a reason and is requesting the live music to be inside.

Dana DiSalvio, co-owner of Sand Box Café at N. 1409 Long Beach Boulevard, thanked Council for the extensions given for outdoor dining and amplified music. She stated that the music at the Sand Box is contained to her property.

Vincent DiSalvio, co- owner of the Sand Box Café, stated the neighbors and renters play louder music than the business establishments.

Debbie Carroll, has worked eight years for the Surf City Hotel and she understands the complaints. The hotel has made a great adjustment, with live music is only played from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm.

Chris Sorenson, Chef from Northside, agrees with what everyone is saying. The news stated the COVID pandemic has been a hardship and is not going away.

Mo Logue, 205 N. 16th Street, lives a block away of the Northside. He does not have issues wit the noise at night, but only twice during the day.

Robert Rizzitello, 338 N. 9th Street, feels the quality of life has improved in Surf City in the past couple of years with the relaxation of the outdoor dining, surfing and music rules.

Rich McDowell, 316 N. 6th Street, thinks it adds to the quality life. It is nice to sit outside and listen to the music. The establishments are maintaining a well-behaved crowd.

Pete Gerhardt, Forked River resident, plays the Northside. A lot of the music played is acoustic and he understands the position of those opposed, but feels the surrounding noise louder from the residences.

Renee Ward, N. 2201 Ocean Avenue, loves the outdoor dining and the live music.

Jaime Ryan, 1519 N. Ocean Avenue and owner of the Cheese Shoppe, he has watched the quality of life in Surf City improve. He said we have been growing and transforming as a community. He feels it draws people to come to Surf City.

Jake owns a house across Surf City (SC) Hotel, he finds the SC Hotel has been respectful. He feels 9:00 pm is too late for the bands, but supports the 7 pm shut down time that the SC Hotel has implemented.

Matt Nichols, wants to reiterate that the music is acoustic. Mayor F. Hodgson asked if he can turn the amplified music down. Matt said he can.

Councilwoman Siciliano asked Matt what hours he books music, he replied 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm.

Greg Gerwirtz, owns the Surf City Hotel, loves the community. He hears what people say and shuts the outdoor music off at 7:00 pm. After that time, it is low (noise) music until 9:00 pm. He has tried to work with the neighbors. The large majority of the residents in the town support the outdoor music. When he thinks the music is too loud, he asks them to lower it.

Mike Casey, 256 N. 11th Street, retired about two years ago and plays guitar at both the Hotel and the Northside. He has been down here for 22 years and he thinks it is a great thing that people can walk and enjoy the outdoor dining.

Todd Kostrub, stated that the band duos use drum machines. He said he hears banging each night.

Vincent DiSalvio, he lives above his restaurant. He does not hear any base or booming through his bedroom wall. The only time he can hear the music when he goes outside.

Debbie Carroll doesn't understand why people complain about only two months.

Bob Burnett gives a comment says a compromise stated 3:00 pm-7:00 pm or 4:00 pm-8:00 pm can be adhered to.

Mayor F. Hodgson states that the Borough may renew it for another 30 days and the businesses should "police" themselves.

Councilman Russell and Councilman Hartney suggests that the Borough continues it for another 30 days and then consider it again next month. Mayor F. Hodgson stated they would have to self-police.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson suggested the drum machines possibly be turned down.

Todd Kostrub said the town should go back to the ordinance.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson said that it's just another 30 days that is being considered. The businesses know that if it is out of control, it will be gone.

Councilwoman Siciliano asked Chief Casella about the calls. Chief Casella stated that the Police Department gives them the opportunity to turn it down.

Councilman Russell moved to approve Resolution 2022-116 in relation to relief to the outdoor amplified music ban. Councilman Hartney seconded it. With a vote in the affirmative, the resolution was approved as attached.

The Doctrine of Necessity was invoked for the consideration of Resolutions 2022-117 through 2022-124 due to the nature of existing conflicts of interest. With that, such action was necessary. Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approved the consent agenda Resolutions 2022-117 through 2022-124. Councilman Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the resolutions were approved as attached.

Mayor F. Hodgson provided the May 2022 Chief Financial Officer & Municipal Court Reports.

Councilman Russell stated that we have about 60 lifeguards, while the rest of the towns are short staffed. He provided the statistical report for June 2022. The LIT program is in full bloom and they are working on a LIT Tournament to take place on August 12th. He moved Resolutions 2022-124 and 2022-126 which were approved as attached.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson provided the statistical report for the Police Department for June 2022. Please be reminded to lock up your bikes. At the Mayors meeting there were some questions and concerns about speeding on Central Avenue and dogs on the beach. The department spot checked and issued local ordinance warnings. Sone people complained about the no right on red light on N. 13th Street. There is a lot of parking there and it is safer with the light.

Councilwoman Siciliano announced that most of the items concerning Surf City's roads have been addressed on the agenda. The scattered sand on N. 15th has been cleaned up and the no parking zones on the corner streets are being freshened up with yellow paint.

Councilman Hartney thanked all who supported and assisted in the fireworks. As of yesterday, the Borough sold 21,444 badges of all types, 609 less than last year. There could be a few reasons, Governor Murphy announced that some beaches are free. It has created a disruption for the badge checkers. Some of the behavior faced by the badge checkers is unruly. Some of this is state law that prohibits the policing of underage drinking. Councilman Hartney sent letters to support the funds for dredging. The bay program has been a big hit this year. The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management had issued an impact statement in relation to the proposed windmills and they only provided 45 days for the public to provide comment. The statement is over 1400 pages long. He moved Resolution 2022-127 requesting a 120-day comment period for the public. He also moved Resolution 2022-125. Both were considered and approved as attached.

A letter was received from Jacqui Bonafede requesting a memorial bench to be located by the Bay and N. 2nd Street. Councilman Russell moved to approved the request. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the requested was approved. Roll call reflected the following votes in approval: Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Susanne Gilbert, 356 N 10th Street, thanked everyone for the fireworks.

Linda Dodulik, 413 N. Central Avenue, stated that it seems as of late, the rain events have been creating even more flooding. Mayor F. Hodgson said the acting Superintendent will contact the County about the stormwater drains. It is a County Street and they would be responsible for raising Central Avenue.

Steve Joerg, 277 N. 13th Street, thanked the Borough Clerk for the research and stated that the beach walkover mats are cost prohibitive.

Mayor F. Hodgson stated the holes in the mats will fill with sand eventually, the tide could come up, someone could trip and would sue the Borough. He commented on a report drafted by the Chief Financial Officer that reflects the local tax increase for all of the requested items, such as mats, garbage can lids, etc. Mayor F. Hodgson commented that this if this is what the people want, then the Borough can get the items requested but the taxes would go up.

Susanne Gilbert stated when the SCTA gets inquiries in that way, they send them to the Borough.

Lexa Merson Cole, 15 N 15th Street, she wrote a letter about requesting street signs on Ocean Terrace and inquired about how to change street addresses. Mayor F. Hodgson addressed the street signs and provided that the Department of Public Works is working on it. The post office is in control of street addresses.

Resolutions 2022-128 to Resolution 2022-133 were considered and approved, as attached.

Mayor F. Hodgson acknowledged the public that appeared to speak to the consideration of Resolution 2022-134, relating to the relief of the outdoor amplified music ban.

Matt Nichols, resident in Surf City and owner of Northside, stated all of his employees downloaded a decibel meter to ensure the noise is not too loud.

Mayor F. Hodgson informed the public present of the email/phone call complaints the offices have received and explained that the decibel meter requires a certified reader.

Joan Moynihan, 31 N. 8th Street, asked why the music has to be amplified. She said it starts at 3 pm and it lasts until 7:15 pm. The crowd does not leave when the music turns off.

Jennifer Bitman, 32 N. 8th Street, said it is terribly loud from 3 pm to 7 pm and then the speakers outside stay on until 9 pm. It is a bar; people are drunk and loud. She went by the Northside and mentioned that it was quieter than she expected. She doesn't feel that asking someone to quiet down is enough and is asking for the music not be amplified.

Chuck Edwards, 242 N. 2nd Street, mentioned Todd Kostrub asked the Surf City Taxpayer Association (SCTA) to intervene on his behalf. The SCTA advised that they do not get involved in member disputes. He offered with Bob Lieber, to set up a meeting with the Northside owner and Todd has rescinded the RSVP for the meeting.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked if the SCTA took a poll. Bob Lieber replied, out of six hundred households – ninety percent of the homeowners are in favor of keeping the music in town.

Jennifer Bitman said taking a poll of people that are unaffected is an inaccurate representation. She suggested getting rid of the amplification and speakers.

Jake Mesa, 36 N. 8th Street, said the problem is that it has continued to expand. Now it's every day. Last month, people talked about neighbor noise being loud. The people who are most affected have no recourse. Music may be shut off in time, but the crowd is not cleared out until 10 pm. The impact of the music is 3 pm through 11 pm at night.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked what he suggested.

He is asking for limits at some point and suggested the music only be on Friday and Saturday.

Joan Moynihan asked if the Borough has a decimeter.

Jennifer Bitman said bars with music, have been inside with music for over forty years now. She said the music needs to go back inside.

Chief Casella stated that the complaints come in through the Clerk's office on Monday morning. Calls should be made to the non-emergency number, as the situation occurs.

Donna McDowell, 201 N. 17th Street, commented that, recently, Northside has been much quieter than usual.

Bob Lieber, 17 N. 12th Street, asked if a homeowner could call the property owner's personal phone to mention the music is too loud, as a possible compromise.

Steve Joerg, 277 N. 13^{th} Street, said the noise is not an issue. It has increased Wednesday through the weekend. He suggested folk music rather than amplified music because musicians cannot police themselves. The idea is to provide ambiance and his suggestion is to limit the days the amplified music.

Mayor F. Hodgson called for any more comments.

Matt Nichols said he is willing to compromise. Northside would limit Wednesday/Thursday music times.

Jennifer Bitman, stated she is confused why the music cannot be inside.

Councilman McMenamin moved that there be no amplified music on Wednesday and Thursday from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm, as recommended by the public present. Councilman Russell seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, Resolution 2022-134 was approved, as attached.

The Doctrine of Necessity was invoked for the consideration of Resolutions 2022-135 & 2022-136 due to conflicts of interest. With that, such action was necessary. Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approved the consent agenda Resolutions 2022-117 through 2022-124. Councilman McMenamin seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the resolutions were approved as attached. Councilman Hartney and Councilman Russell recused themselves.

Mayor F. Hodgson provided the Chief Financial Officer and Municipal Court reports for June 2022.

Councilman McMenamin read the sanitation report. He then moved Resolution 2022-139, which was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilman Russell announced the lifeguard report for July 2022. The water temp average has been the lowest since we have been keeping record, about sixty-two degrees. The first Borough hosted Lifeguard in Training tournament is this Friday. The Gator operation is going very well.

Many lifeguards will be going back to school soon. He moved Resolution 2022-137, appointing additional lifeguards, which was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilwoman Siciliano stated that streets & roads are very busy. Our next major road project will be out to bid in the coming weeks. Lenny Wilson, acting Borough Superintendent is creating a list for pot hole repairs. The DPW continues to repair street ends and barricades. She then moved Resolutions 2022-138 and 2022-141, both were considered and approved, as attached.

Councilman Hartney announced that the Tuesday Bay program is a great success. The beach rake was down for one day but the acting Borough Superintendent got it up and running. He provided the monthly badge report. He moved Resolution 2022-140, which was considered and approved, as attached.

A letter was received from Kyle Costabile requesting permission to borrow snow fence and barricades for the 2nd annual Cornhole Tournament on Saturday, September 24, 2022. Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approve the request. Councilman McMenamin seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the request was approved utilizing the doctrine of necessity.

Mayor F. Hodgson called for any comments from the public.

Tony Pace, 333 N. 1st Street, would like to improve the tennis/pickleball courts. He is asking to resurface the courts, paint visible lines, install 6-foot wind curtains, and finally consider putting four pickleball courts, where two exist. Mayor F. Hodgson confirmed that nets can be wheeled around to create pickleball courts.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained that the courts do not stay level due to their location. The Borough received quotes that it would be \$60,000 to rehabilitate the tennis/pickleball courts. Taxes will go up when spending. Some people are asking for a full playground at the Bay beach, and want shade pavilions and mats on all of the beaches. The most important spending is to stay ahead of the flooding and raise the roads. The committee can bring information about the prices of the pickleball court. Mr. Pace agreed.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained further that Bay Beach is not a playground. The Borough met the taxpayer requests over time which is why a couple of things are there. It is not a playground or a picnic area, it's a beach. We cannot add to the sand. The Borough added sand at one time and the State called and demanded it is removed.

Steve O'Brien, 286 N. 17^{th} Street, recommended relocating the courts if they cannot be maintained at that location by the Bay. He would like to stay home in Surf City and play pickleball.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained that the Borough made an offer to buy the EJ School for more recreational space.

Tom Carey, 917 Long Beach Boulevard, brought up areas in the Borough that do not have stop signs. Mayor F. Hodgson assured Mr. Carey that Chief Casella is looking into it.

Paul Tighe, 105 S. Barnegat Avenue, was on the beach today and he was not permitted to use a monopole umbrella he had just purchased. He claims that it is safer than an umbrella.

The Borough Clerk explained the ordinance being introduced in relation to umbrellas on the beach.

Paul Tighe also asked about the electric golf carts in town. Chief Casella explains that golf carts are actually low-speed vehicles.

Bill Hennig, 318 S. 1st Street, described the low-speed vehicle he just bought.

Donna McDowell spoke again to give "kudos" to Surf City Police Department for their aid in rescues.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained that we have to address bike riding on the sidewalk and not obeying traffic laws.

Jim Nast, 16 N. Central Avenue, advised that the SCTA agreed to start a committee to provide public relations for pedestrian and bike safety.

Steve O'Brien thinks that the most dangerous section is the corner of N. 17th Street and Barnegat Avenue. The acting Borough Superintendent was instructed to ask the County to check all the signs.

With no further comments, Councilman Russell moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the meeting was adjourned.

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING IN PART BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2021-11 ADOPTED ON AUGUST 11, 2021, PROVIDING FOR THE 2021 ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AND RELATED EXPENSES FOR THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN ORDER TO INCREASE THE APPROPRIATION THEREFOR BY \$150,000 FOR A TOTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$850,000, TO INCREASE THE AUTHORIZED BONDS AND NOTES TO BE ISSUED TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF BY \$142,500 FOR A TOTAL DEBT AUTHORIZATION OF \$807,500, AND TO INCREASE THE ALLOCATION OF THE APPROPRIATION TO COSTS PERMITTED UNDER N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of Surf City, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough") finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2021-11 on August 11, 2021 (the "Prior Ordinance") providing for the 2021 Road Improvement Project and related expenses for the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the costs associated with said improvements are higher than anticipated and has determined to supplement the appropriation and bonds and notes authorized therefor; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the \$80,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance for purposes permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is insufficient and desires to increase such allocation by \$10,000 to an aggregate amount of \$90,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough and were previously authorized by the Borough by the Prior Ordinance. For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$150,000 in addition to the \$700,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including \$372,200 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) and previously appropriated by the Prior Ordinance, and including the sum of \$42,500 as down payment, \$35,000 of such down payment was previously appropriated by the Prior Ordinance, and an additional down payment of \$7,500 is authorized hereby and is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes, \$142,500 negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in addition to the \$665,000 previously

authorized by the Prior Ordinance for a total principal amount not to exceed \$807,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued consist of the 2021 Road Improvement Project, including, but not limited to, improvements to North 1st Street and North 3rd Street located in the Borough, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$807,500 including the \$142,500 authorized herein, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$850,000, which is equal to the amount of the \$150,000 supplemental appropriation herein made therefor and the \$700,000 appropriation made by the Prior Ordinance.
- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$142,500 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$90,000, including \$10,000 authorized hereby and \$80,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance, for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.
- (e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.
- Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available there for public inspection.
- Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.
- Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy *advalorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or are inconsistent. In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 10. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ROAD RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS, APPROPRIATING \$700,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$665,000 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Surf City, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$700,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$35,000 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$665,000, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the reconstruction of and improvements to various streets throughout the Borough, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$665,000, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$700,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The

excess of the appropriation of \$700,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of said \$35,000 down payment for said purposes.

- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$665,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$140,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be

paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto.

Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and

capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file

with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for Section 7.

the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment

of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual

payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property

within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation

as to rate or amount.

Councilman McMenamin provided the sanitation report for August 2022. The Borough has received \$5,942.00 from Ocean County for the recycling tonnage grant. He then moved Resolution 2022-152. Councilwoman Siciliano seconded the motion. Resolution 2022-152 was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilman Russell is happy to report that the Borough had a successful lifeguard season. Our beaches remained open the entire 80-day season. There is no other town on the island that can make that statement. The lifeguard captain has several past employees he can call upon when needed, and he should be commended for that. The lifeguard in training program helped the Borough to staff the stands. He provided the beach patrol statistical report for the season. Mr. Russell wanted to thank Angela and Jaime Ryan for their generous donation of lifeguard equipment. He moved Resolution 2022-153. Councilman Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. Resolution 2022-152 was considered and approved, as attached.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson provided the August 2022 statistical report for the police department. The Department collected food for the pantry at the St. Francis Center. The Fire and Police Departments will spearhead the annual trunk or treat event on October 29, 2022. It is a great safe, fun event that includes different activities. He thanked all involved for their efforts in setting up the trunk or treat.

Councilwoman Siciliano reported that the Department of Public Works continues pothole repairs and cuts street ends. We are in a thirty-day review with the State for the current road project. Once approved, we can go through the bid process. The County turned the traffic lights on Sept 12, 2022.

Ellie Galante, 223 N. 8th Street, inquired about the N. 8th Street NJDOT application.

Councilman Hartney provided the Fire Department statistical report. The donors of the fireworks are on Board for fireworks for next year on or around the 4th of July. The Tuesday Bay

program has three hundred ten verified visitors with thirty observers. It averaged about fifty people a week; this is the end of the twelfth year. He mentioned he had referred people to Bob Stern for concerns about the windmill. Tom Hughes of the Seashell sponsored a thirty-second video ad. They anticipated a draft of an impact statement at the end of December. He spoke more in-depth about the lawsuit. He also talked to the Deputy Chief of Staff in Senator Booker's office. He and Congressman Van Drew advocated for money for the upcoming beach replenishment. Aiden sold over one thousand of the most beaches this season, the highest weekly seller of all time. Isabelle and Grace were very close runners-up. Another young lady named Wynter deserves an honorable mention for her efforts in only working part of the season. The holiday badges were ordered for the season. He provided the annual revenue report for beach badge sales. He moved Resolution 2022-154. Councilman Russell seconded the motion. Resolution 2022-154 was considered and approved, as attached.

Many of the public were present at the meeting to discuss the consideration of Resolution 2022-151 about amplified music.

Matt Nichols, 301 N. 4^{th} Street, owner of the Northside, said he was interested in meeting with the people to compromise.

Mayor F. Hodgson read the petition that was submitted opposing outdoor amplified music.

Todd Kostrub, 1719 Long Beach Boulevard, is one of the individuals they are trying to reach. He does not want the offers that the Surf City Taxpayers Association (SCTA) and Dan Malay have proposed. He said the music could be heard loudly blocks away.

Colleen Gewirtz, the owner of Surf City Hotel, sees that the Hotel already aligns with the proposed compromises. She understood that each business would be treated individually.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked if the music could be played without the amplification.

Colleen Gerwirtz said it can, but it strains the musician's voices. If she can hear the music on the third floor, she asks the staff to lower the music.

Discussion continued about amplification and potential compromises with the same group of people.

Mike Casey, 256 N. $11^{\rm th}$ Street, suggested a survey be taken.

Suzanne Troy, 1717 Central Avenue, feels someone from the Board should be more involved in the effort to compromise.

Mayor F. Hodgson stated that we gave the business every edge during the pandemic. The borough clerk met with Dan Malay only a week ago to review the status of the compromise.

Lisa Smartt, 262 N. 5th Street, asked if a petition would be helpful from the other side of the point of view and said that the persons complaining about the music purchased the homes near bars.

Mayor F. Hodgson stressed again that we could not ignore the people annoyed by the music.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson pointed out that the town made accommodations. The State's edict is that we may allow outdoor seating, but we do not have to. We need to reach reasonable accommodations. It is unnecessary to do a survey that would provide too much information to sift through. During the off-season, the Borough will review the policy.

Councilwoman Siciliano stated that the cold weather was approaching and getting darker earlier.

Steve Quinn, 362 N. 6th Street, is a musician; musicians cannot play without amplification. He suggested the musicians be shifted to face the buildings to let the music play lower.

Jim Nast spoke for Chuck Edwards; ninety percent of the people want outdoor music, per the survey from the SCTA.

Seymour Josephson, 114 S. 1st Street, the outdoor music has benefited the business and the residents.

Jake Mesa, 36 N. 8th Street, doesn't feel that, as a resident, he should be in the position to voice his concerns about listening to music. He said drinking and listening to music in a parking lot is not fun.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked for suggestions from the audience. Jake Mesa suggested limiting the days.

Mike Casey said the compromise last month was not t a holistic solution.

Colleen suggests that music be allowed for four hours on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Maybe limit the number of musicians. Mayor F. Hodgson said we would not interfere with the number of musicians and asked what everyone thought. Most of the crowd expressed support for the proposal.

The amplified music will be permitted on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm and on Sundays from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The resolution will be effective for the remainder of the year. Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approve Resolution 2022-151 about the outdoor amplified music relief. Councilman Russell seconded the motion. Resolution 2022-152 was considered and approved, as attached.

Ed Marhefka, 240 N. 24^{th} Street, asked if Council would look into a different type of cans.

Mayor F. Hodgson said we don't like to spend money. We will get them what they want, but it will increase taxes. We have been discussing it with a group that said they would find a grant. The group suggested the funding we already use.

Ashely Connor, an Alliance for a Living Ocean (ALO) representative, stood to speak about the proposal ALO submitted for trash cans lids throughout the Borough. Mayor F. Hodgson

addressed the misrepresentation ALO had made in a recent Sandpaper article about the Borough's position on the matter.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked what position the ALO takes on the proposed windmills.

Ashley Connor asked if Mayor F. Hodgson had questions about the proposal and claimed she wasn't present to discuss the windmills.

Councilman Hartney suggested the proposal be shifted to the Environmental Committee.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson mentioned the new household trash enforcement stickers added to the trash cans. The household trash being dumped at the litter cans is not being enforced.

Mayor F. Hodgson pointed out that the cans are for litter, not household trash. He suggested that Peter speaks with her about the broad issue of litter.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson asked about the ALO's position on the proposed windmills.

Brittany McLaughlin, ALO Executive Director, told the Council to look up the ALO position on windmills in the past Sandpaper news article.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson requested that ALO could send a letter with their positions on the windmill.

Lisa Smartt talked more about the size of the holes in trash cans and suggested the Borough use the surplus to pay for trash cans and pickleball courts.

Anthony Pace and Lisa Smartt both proposed that they would pay for a special badge to play pickleball. Many people in the crowd voiced their agreement to use a special badge to pay for the improvements to the pickleball courts.

Mayor F. Hodgson reminded the crowd that the surplus is for emergencies.

Lisa Smartt, 262 N. 5^{th} Street, said she doesn't mind paying more taxes for nicer recreational areas and trash cans with lids.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson pointed out that \$5 million does not go far if a few sewer laterals have to be replaced.

Ed Mareftka asked if the additional money raised by taxes for improved properties could be reserved each year for the improvements.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained that salaries and costs go up each year. He asked the crowd if they were aware the school taxes for the middle and high school taxes went up over a million dollars in one year.

Kathleen Hogan, 280 N. 17th Street, asked about the budget.

Steve Quinn said we appreciate the management of the funds; we have to take care of the funds, but the park is embarrassing. He asked if we could use ADA funds for ramps.

It was decided that the Public Property would move forward in the planning, bidding, and executing of the pickleball court improvements.

Councilman Hartney moved to approve paying the bills. Councilman Russell seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative of the members present, the bills were approved to be paid.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, 2000" AS THE SAME IN CHAPTER 30 PERTAINS TO "ZONING".

The Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City do ordain:

SECTION I

Chapter 30 Section 18 be hereby added to the chapter, as follows.

- A. Definitions. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:
 - 1) PERSON Individuals, partnerships, voluntary associations, and corporations.
 - 2) PODS Any temporary storage units which are the equivalent of trailers without wheels or of lesser size and are typically used for storage or transport of personal property.
- B. Permit required; fee. It shall be unlawful for any person to store, park or place any storage pod upon any residential property within the Borough of Surf City without first filing for a permit with the Surf City Zoning Department containing the information hereinafter specified and obtaining from such clerk made permit to do so, which shall be known as a "pod permit." The fee for such a permit is hereby fixed at \$50 for each issuance. Such filing shall be made at least 48 hours prior to the placement of the pod upon the property within the Borough.
- C. Restrictions on permits.
 - 1) Any temporary storage permit shall be issued for a duration not to exceed 90 days. Any such permit may be reissued for an additional period of 90 days without an additional fee but no further reissuance shall take place. In no event shall a pod remain upon property within the Borough of Surf City beyond the time frame set forth within the permit. In addition, any pod situated upon the property shall not infringe upon any setbacks mandated by the local zoning ordinance, with the exception of front yard setbacks for pods that are placed in a driveway. There will be no pods stored on Borough of Surf City streets.
 - 2) The use of a pod for the construction or reconstruction of a home for the storage of materials related to that construction may be situated for the duration of the construction, but any such pod for construction-related purposes shall be removed within 30 days after the issuance of a CO/CA for the dwelling under construction.

- D. Display permit. Each permit issued under this chapter must be prominently displayed on the premises upon which the pod is located during the entire period the pod remains on the property.
- E. Information to be filed. A copy of the approved application to be filed with the Borough Clerk & Chief of Police by the Zoning Official pursuant to this chapter shall be as follows:
 - 1) Name of the person, firm, group, corporation, association or organization renting or owning the pod who has responsibility for the placement and removal of the pod.
 - 2) Name of the owner of the property upon which the pod is to be located and the consent of the owner of the permit applicant is other than the owner.
 - 3) Location upon the property in which the pod is to be located.
 - 4) Date upon which the pod shall be removed from the property.
 - 5) Purpose for which the pod is to be placed upon the property.
 - 6) Sworn statement or affirmation by the person requesting the permit that the information there and given is full and true and known by him or her to do so.

F. Restrictions:

1) There will be no double stacking of pods.

G. Exceptions:

- 1) This section does not apply to PODS being delivered and removed within the same day for moving purposes only.
- H. Waiver of requirements. Upon application by any bona fide charitable, educational, cultural, or governmental institution or organization, the Mayor and Council may waive any or all of the requirements of this section, provided that the burden of establishing eligibility for such a waiver shall be on the organization applying for the waiver.

SECTION II

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A LIVESCAN MACHINE, APPROPRIATING \$30,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$28,500 BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Surf City, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$30,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$1,500 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for a down payment or capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.
- Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes not provided for by the application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount not to exceed \$28,500, pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.
- Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which the obligations are to be issued consist of the acquisition of a LiveScan machine for the Borough Police Department, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with contracts, plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$28,500, as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$30,000, which is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor. The

excess of the appropriation of \$30,000 over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefore being the amount of said \$1,500 down payment for said purposes.

- Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is fifteen (15) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$28,500 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$1,500 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto.

Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements within the appropriation herein authorized or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Councilman Russell concurred, stating the equipment would be placed on a temp pole.

Mayor F. Hodgson addressed false information given by some; it was stated that the Borough has debt. He explained bonded indebtedness and informed the public that the Borough does not pay interest to any outside agency. The surplus allows the Borough to borrow from itself.

The Chief Financial Officer, Mike Gross, explained that when an ordinance is adopted, it is authorized and unissued debt. He also explained how the Borough pays the bond over time.

Anthony Pace, 333 S. 1st Street, asked how the Borough acquired a surplus.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained that each unexpended line item in the budget goes into the surplus.

Mr. Pace then asked why the Borough doesn't have extra money with the added assessments.

Mayor F. Hodgson offered that the Borough is not immune from inflation. The Department of Public Works went from \$12 per hour to \$17 per hour this year. The Borough buys used vehicles from Ocean County for one dollar. Ocean County took over Barnegat Avenue, which saves money. The department heads all work very hard to save money. Mayor F. Hodgson also mentioned how some of the public make derogatory comments to the staff.

Councilman Wm. Hodgson agreed and stated that the Chief also does his best to save money. The department heads do everything they can to return money each year to the taxpayers – that is how Council has ingrained the departments to operate.

Susanne Gilbert and Bob Lieber complimented the Borough Clerk on behalf of the Board of Directors.

Bob Lieber requested a meeting with the CFO to understand the municipal budget better; he agreed to meet with the SCTA.

Mayor F. Hodgson explained the additional regulations the State has been passing, creating more work for the Borough offices and more "fees" for the public. He also explained the certifications the licensed department heads acquire and the maintenance that goes into keeping them.

Bob Lieber complimented the town, stating it is exceptionally well managed. Susanne Gilbert and the other SCTA members present complimented the DPW.

Jim Nast, 16 S. Central Avenue, joked and asked if Council could get new chairs for the dais – as someone had a squeaky chair.

It just so happened that new chairs had been ordered a few days before the meeting. Mayor F. Hodgson explained that the chairs were purchased in 1969. Councilman Little reminisced about his time on Council twenty-five years ago.

With no further comments, Councilman Russell moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the meeting was adjourned.

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER II OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" SO ESTABLISH NEW ARTICLE VIII ENTITLED "THIRD-PARTY PAYROLL DISBURSEMENT" AUTHORIZING THE USE OF THIRD-PARTY DISBURSEMENT SERVICE FOR PAYROLL AND OTHER SPECIFIED AGENT **PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, pursuant to its statutory authority under N.J.S.A. 52:27D-20.1, the Local Finance Board promulgated regulations governing "Electronic Disbursement Controls for Payroll Purposes" set forth at N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.1 et seq.

WHEREAS, in relevant part, N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.3:(a) provides for an ordinance to be adopted authorizing the use of a third-party disbursement service organization for payroll and other specified purposes;

WHEREAS, the Borough seeks to adopt the required ordinance to allow for the use of a third-party disbursement service for the handling of the Borough's payroll and other related human resources functions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Surf City in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter II of the Borough Code of the Borough of Surf City entitled "Administration" is hereby amended and supplemented to add new Article VIII entitled "Third-Party Payroll Disbursement" which shall read as follows:

ARTICLE VIII THIRD-PARTY PAYROLL DISBURSEMENT

2-70. Purpose.

The purpose and intent of these regulations is to abide by the requirements of N.J.S.A. 52:27D-20.1 and N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.1 et seq., governing electronic disbursement controls for payroll purposes.

2-70.1. Definitions.

As used in this Article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

APPROVAL OFFICER – Person(s) responsible for authorizing and supervising the activities of the payroll service.

PAYROLL SERVICE - Third-party payroll service organization.

BOROUGH - Borough of Surf City.

2-70.2. Authorization.

- a. The Borough is authorized to use a payroll service to prepare payment documentation, take possession of Borough funds, and make such disbursements itself on behalf of the Borough, including the direct deposit of payroll disbursements.
- b. The following payroll service providers shall be required to comply with these regulations:
 - (1) Payroll service providers who use their own customized programming process to execute disbursements for the Borough;
 - (2) Payroll service providers who use a third-party processor to execute disbursements for the Borough.

2-70.3 Borough requirements.

a. The appointment of a payroll service shall be pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. and

shall require the contractor to do the following, not by way of limitation: data collection, agency report preparation, calculation of withholding, direct deposit of payroll disbursements, and/or transfer of Borough funds to contractor's account for subsequent disbursement of payment.

- b. Any renewal or extension of a contract under these regulations shall be by resolution.
- c. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby appointed the approval officer and is responsible for authorizing and supervising the activities of the payroll service and shall further be charged with the reconciliation and analysis of all general ledger accounts affected by the activities of the disbursing organization.
- d. If required by the contract between the Borough and the payroll service, the payroll service is permitted to hold Borough funds pending transmittal to a payee.

2-70.4 Payroll service requirements.

- a. A payroll service must meet all of the following requirements:
 - (1) Report any irregularities that may indicate potential fraud, noncompliance with appropriate laws, dishonesty or gross incompetence on the part of the approval officer;
 - (2) Report circumstances that could jeopardize its ability to continue operations or otherwise interrupt the services provided to the Borough.
- b. A payroll service must meet the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.5, requiring that the approval officer be assured that the servicer has its own internal controls and appropriately guards against theft and other adverse conditions.
- c. All contracts entered into pursuant to these regulations and the laws authorizing the same shall comply with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:30-17.6, which sets out a series of mandatory contractual terms and conditions.

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2-70.5. Establishment of service.

The Borough shall enter into a contract for payroll service in accordance with all local public contracting laws and N.J.A.C. 5:30-17. Appointment of the payroll service shall be by resolution of the Borough.

SECTION 2. Authorization.

The Borough Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to take any and all steps reasonably necessary to effectuate the foregoing, including any anticipatory steps following introduction of this ordinance that are appropriate for implementation upon final adoption.

SECTION 3. Severability.

If any section, subsection or paragraph of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative, in whole or in part, by a court of competent jurisdiction, such chapter, section subchapter or paragraph shall to the extent that is not held unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative remain in full force and effect and shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Repealer.

All ordinances and resolutions, and parts of ordinances and resolutions which are inconsistent with provisions of this ordinance shall be, and are hereby, repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

SECTION 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

Fee for renovations, alterations, repairs, etc. shall be amended to the amount of \$30 per \$1,000 for \$50,000 or less. From \$50,001 to and including \$100,000, the additional fee shall be in the amount of \$23 per \$1,000 of estimated cost above the \$50,000. Above \$100,000, the additional fee shall be in the amount of \$19 per \$1,000 of estimated cost above \$100,000.

Section 11-1.2(a)(6) Building Subcode Fee shall be amended to read as follows:

The fee for roofing or siding in R-3 and R-4 uses shall be \$100.

Section 11-1.2(f)(7) Other permit fees should be amended to read as follows:

Fee for a demolition permit: is \$100.

SECTION II

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION III

If any word, phrase, clause, section, or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION IV

This ordinance shall take effect immediately after final adoption according to law.

Section 30-10.3 titled Permit; Fee shall be amended to read as follows:

An application for a permit, accompanied by an application fee of \$50, shall be made to the Zoning Officer; a permit must be obtained prior to erecting or installing any sign in the Business Zone, except signs giving only directions to or only identifying parking areas.

Section 30-10.3(c) titled Permits shall be amended to read as follows:
