ORDINANCE NO. 2026-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 19 OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY ENTITLED, "PARKS, BEACHES, AND RECREATIONAL AREAS" SO AS TO REVISE THE REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE USE OF THE BOAT RAMP

BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Surf City, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 19-3 of Chapter 19 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Surf City, entitled "Borough-Owned Parking Area and Boat Ramp on the Bayfront Between South First Street and North First Street," is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 19-3. BOROUGH-OWNED PARKING AREA AND BOAT RAMP ON THE BAY FRONT BETWEEN SOUTH FIRST STREET AND NORTH FIRST STREET.

§ 19-3.1. Parking Area Established.

The facilities of the Borough-owned parking area between South First Street and North First Street, extending from the westerly side of Barnegat Avenue to the bayfront, all such premises lying within the boundaries of the Richard A. Zachariae Recreation Area, is to be used for parking, solely by cars with trailers attached, or detached boat trailers, in either case permitted as hereafter provided, and shall

be used for such parking only in connection with boat launching or retrieval.

§ 19-3.2. Boat Ramp Pass Required; Fees.

A pass/permit for the purposes stated in subsection 19-3.1 and for the use of the boat ramp shall be obtained pursuant to this section and in accordance with the following fee schedule. The parking of any motor vehicle or trailers or utilization of the boat ramp without a pass/permit is specifically prohibited.

- a. For daily use of the boat ramp or parking lot- \$20.
- b. For use of the boat ramp or parking lot for commercial purposes- \$500 for the season.
- c. For a seasonal pass to use the boat ramp or parking lot- \$100.

Seasonal use means from January 1 to December 31 of the year the pass is obtained.

§ 19-3.3. Exceptions.

Any provision of this section to the contrary, notwithstanding, only the automobiles of persons utilizing the children's playground, ball field, tennis courts, pickleball and basketball courts may use the foregoing area for parking without a pass/permit. Such parking may only be for the period in which the above-mentioned recreational areas are being utilized.

§ 19-3.4. Application for Pass.

Any person applying for a pass/permit as authorized herein must provide their registration for the trailer used for the boat ramp. The Borough shall provide appropriate signage providing instructions for obtaining a pass/permit.

§ 19-3.5. Prohibited Parking.

The parking of vehicles and/or trailers overnight shall be strictly prohibited. For the purpose of this subsection, overnight shall be between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after the second reading and publication as required by law.
