

**Borough of Surf City
Governing Body Meeting Minutes**

Mayor F. Hodgson called the meeting to order and read the following statement. In compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act of the State of New Jersey, pursuant to P.L. 2025, c.72, adequate notice of this meeting of the Borough Council has been provided on the Borough website and two online papers.

The roll call reflected the following members present: Councilman Joe DeBenedetto, Councilman Peter M. Hartney, Councilman William D. Hodgson, Councilman Lee Lieber, Councilman Gerry P. Little, Councilwoman Jacqueline L. Siciliano, and Mayor Francis R. Hodgson.

Borough Superintendent Art Yahn, Chief Jack Casella, and CFO Michael Gross attended.

All present joined Mayor F. Hodgson in a salute to the Flag.

Councilman Hartney moved to approve the minutes from the April 8, 2026, regular meeting. Council President Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to approve the first reading by title of Ordinance 2026-13. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano. This ordinance establishes a CAP bank, increasing the 2026 Budget by 3.5% (\$266,919.20).

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-13

ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK AUTHORIZED BY THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN. (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14).

Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to open the public hearing on Ordinance 2026-12. Councilwoman Siciliano seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano. There were no comments. Councilman Hartney moved to close the public hearing. Council President Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Councilman Hartney moved to approve the final reading and adoption by title for Ordinance 2026-12. Council President Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes in favor of adopting Ordinance 2026-12: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano. This ordinance revises boat ramp fees & procedures.

Councilwoman Siciliano moved to approve the introduction and first reading by title for Ordinance 2026-12. Council President Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano. This ordinance revises the personnel manual.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-12

ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 3 OF THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY ENTITLED “PERSONNEL POLICIES” SO AS TO REVISE THE BOROUGH POLICY REGARDING ADDITIONAL SICK LEAVE UNDER THE EMPLOYEES’ INCOME PROTECTION PROGRAM FOR SICKNESS AND ACCIDENTS.

Resolutions 2026-91 through Resolutions 2026-98 were considered and approved, as attached.

Mayor F. Hodgson read the Municipal Court and Chief Financial Officer reports.

Councilman Lieber read the monthly highlights for the police department. One of the new officers completed the SLEO training at the Ocean County Policy Academy.

Councilman DeBenedetto reported that preparations for the upcoming season at recreation and public facilities are progressing well. Lifeguards are in place and ready for the season, and the Gator program schedule is nearing completion. At Veterans’ Park, several trees will be removed as part of ongoing maintenance, and Ocean County has provided and ordered new trash cans and water fountains for the Borough. The engineer’s office is currently evaluating the floor joists at Borough Hall. Repairs to the Bay Beach pavilion have been completed, and a new bay beach shower is being ordered. Work on the boat ramp is also advancing and is expected to be completed soon.

Council President Wm. Hodgson provided the March 2026 Sanitation Report. He also advised everyone that one of the trash trucks needs extensive repairs.

Councilwoman Siciliano, the Department of Public Works (DPW) installed street signs on Sunset Avenue, completed hot patching of potholes, and cleared drainage basins throughout the Borough. The County has lowered the speed limits, and the traffic lights are scheduled to

become active on May 18. All Phase I road projects have been completed. ARPA Phase I projects have been successfully completed, including the bulkhead replacements at 12th and 13th Streets and roadway improvements on several streets throughout the Borough. Minor punch list items remain for the Phase I road projects.

ARPA Phase II bulkhead work is progressing well, with the bulkheads and outfall pipes at 18th, 23rd, and 24th Streets substantially complete and remaining work focused on caps, tide valves, and site restoration. Bulkhead replacement work continues at 11th Street and remains completed at 6th, 7th, and 8th Streets. Phase II roadway improvements are also advancing, with drainage, curbs, and paving complete and final restoration and striping work underway. In addition, 10th, 13th, and 15th Streets were reconstructed through the 2024 NJDOT grant program. Planning is expected to begin soon for the next round of NJDOT grant applications for 2025 and 2026. Councilwoman Siciliano wished everyone a fabulous season.

Councilman Hartney mentioned that Earle assisted Matt by lifting his 700-pound wheelchair and modifying the location to ensure Matt could safely enter the house. He presented the beach badge report and announced that the Borough now accepts credit card payments for beach badge purchases, providing added convenience for residents and guests. In addition, Surf City's beach badge program received national recognition when it was featured on the *Today Show*. Beach mats will be used to improve beach access. Discussion continued regarding a proposed Assembly Bill that, if passed, would require municipalities to include associated expenses within their Municipal Public Access Plans. The legislation could also require municipalities to reopen and update their Master Plans annually. Peter reached out to Assemblyman Myhre regarding these matters. The Borough submitted its Municipal Public Access Plan in 2016 and is still awaiting State approval.

Councilman Little provided the April 2026 water and sewer report. The Water and Sewer Department continues to make progress on several infrastructure and maintenance projects. Routine plant maintenance remains ongoing. During this reporting period, three service lines were replaced, five new meter pits and lids were installed, and lead and copper sampling were completed. Improvements to Well No. 7 were completed, including the replacement of the motor pump and valve. The repair and replacement of the blow-off main at the end of 12th Street has also been completed. In addition, renovations to the water maintenance shop on South 3rd Street are currently underway.

The Surf City Taxpayers Association (SCTA) requests permission to host a concert for Surf City residents at Richard A. Zachariae Park on June 20, 2026, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. The request is for amplified music, use of the ball field, and additional trash cans. A cost-free zoning permit would be required for signage. Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to approve the event. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for

approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

SCTA requests permission to host a Sand Sculpture Contest on Wednesday, August 5, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Signage is requested, and a cost-free zoning permit would be required. Councilman Hartney moved to approve the event. Council President Wm. Hodgson seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Allison Craft requests approval for a memorial bench for Maria Creedon. Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to approve the request. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes in favor of approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Arlene Morrison requests permission to “Turn the Town Teal” with ribbons for Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month in September. Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to approve the request, provided the ribbons are evenly distributed throughout the town. Councilman Hartney seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes in favor of approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Mr. Simon attended the meeting and requested to host another run next year. Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to approve the request. Councilman Lieber seconded the motion. The roll call reflected the following votes in favor of approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Council President Wm. Hodgson moved to pay the bills. Councilman Lieber seconded the motion. The bills were approved for payment. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

Mayor F. Hodgson asked if anyone had comments or questions.

Scott Mariani thanked the Council and Borough for their support in the recent 5K.

During public comment, Kathy Casey raised questions regarding the boat ramp, water fountains, and water and sewer bills. She reiterated her position that homes with swimming pools should be subject to higher water and sewer charges. Mayor F. Hodgson discussed the costs associated with operating the Borough's water and sewer system, while Councilman Little explained that the Borough does not purchase water from neighboring municipalities and noted that most swimming pools are filled by water delivery trucks rather than through the municipal system. Mayor Hodgson also observed that all residents contribute to the library tax regardless of whether they personally use the library.

Ron Fiore inquired about the need to replace several fire hydrants throughout the Borough. Councilman Little explained that the Water and Sewer Department regularly surveys the system, identifies infrastructure needs, and makes recommendations for replacement. Mayor Hodgson added that the Borough's goal is to ensure that all equipment and infrastructure remain up to current standards.

Councilman Hartney moved to adjourn the meeting. Councilwoman Siciliano seconded the motion. With a vote in the affirmative, the meeting was adjourned. The roll call reflected the following votes for approval: Mr. DeBenedetto, Mr. Hartney, Mr. Wm. Hodgson, Mr. Lieber, Mr. Little, and Mrs. Siciliano.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF SURF CITY, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF
NEW JERSEY, EXERCISING THE RIGHT OF THE GOVERNING BODY TO EXAMINE
AND CERTIFY THE 2026 MUNICIPAL BUDGET LOCALLY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b, the Local Finance Board has adopted rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 5:30-7.5, the Borough of Surf City has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Borough of Surf City meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2026;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Surf City, County of Ocean, that, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b, and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the Borough Council has found the budget and has met the following requirements:

With reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated under law and appropriated as such in the budget:

- Payment of interest and debt redemption charges.
- Deferred charges and statutory expenditures.
- Cash deficit and statutory expenditures.
- Cash deficit the preceding year.
- Reserve for uncollected taxes.
- Other reserves and non-disbursement items.
- Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- That the provisions relating to the limitation on increases of appropriations, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N. J. S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq. (complies with "cap" law) are fully met.
- That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N. J. A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.

That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:

- All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated.
- Items of appropriation are adequately set forth.
- That itemization, form, arrangement, and content of the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

- The budget and the associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent certification.
- That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE FURTHER RESOLVED THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Division of Local Government Services Director.

This payment may be made based on the rate of one (1) week of additional sick pay for each year of employment with the Borough. Only those employees covered by the insurance company may be entitled to this additional sick leave. Employees are entitled to only one (1) claim for additional sick pay in a 12-month rolling period, subject to Borough approval.
